

HTC's DIRECTORS IN 2006

Five great plays coming your way next year and here we introduce the Directors.

The Company is pleased to welcome Morgan Dowsett as director of the first play of the 2006 Season. Morgan will direct the comedy, **The Knackers ABC** by Boris Vian. This is the first time Morgan has directed for the Company. Since arriving in Australia a few years ago from the USA, Morgan has directed for the Melbourne French Theatre and will direct **Circularity** in the Short & Sweet Playwriting Competition to be held at the Arts Centre in December.

Gayle Poor will direct **Emma Celebrazione**, the second production in our 2006 Season. Gayle has built a fine reputation as a director in Melbourne, and has worked extensively with Eltham Little Theatre. Gayle directed **This Old Man Comes Rolling Home** at HTC in 2003; and it is with much pleasure she is welcomed back to direct with the Company next year.

Art by Yasmina Reza, the third play in our 2006 Season will be directed by Wayne Pearn. Wayne has played many roles at HTC over the years, both on stage, as a director, Committee Member, Adjudicator and more lately as Chairperson of the Play Selection Committee. Wayne last directed at HTC in 2004 – The Iceman Cometh, the first play he directed for the Company was Equus in 1992 followed by Good Works in 1999.

Geoff Hickey is a much sort after director around the Melbourne non professional theatre scene, and the Company is delighted to welcome him back as director of its fourth offering in 2006, Cat On A Hot Tin Roof by Tennessee Williams. Geoff first directed for the Company in 1992 with Summer of the 17th Doll, followed by Come Back to the 5 & Dime Jimmy Dean, Jimmy Dean – 1994, and M. Butterfly in 1996. He last appeared on stage at HTC in The Iceman Cometh in 2004.

Following the very successful production of **The Castle** in 2004, directed by Maureen McInerney, Maureen will again lead the team to direct **Front Page**, the Company's final production for 2006. What a line up!!

Noises Off

Michael Frayn's comedy-farce **Noises Off**, a play within a play, has been successfully performed both professionally and on the community circuit in numerous productions since it premiered in London in 1982.

The show commences on the stage of the 'Grand Theatre', a slightly tragic British repertory company are rehearsing the bedroom farce 'Nothing On'. The cast struggle through the technical rehearsal under the jaded direction of Lloyd Dallas, former darling of the British Theatre establishment, now 'hack for hire' and philanderer. The production is being funded by its star Dotty Otley (Barbara Hughes) a veteran of British stage and small screen trying to make a nest egg for her old age.

The production does not go according to plan and what we see is Act 1 of the play 'Nothing On' with the actors forgetting cues, being confused about what to do with their props, the timing is out and the director speaks to this hapless cast as if they were children, listening ever so patiently to their muddled excuses and then giving them a serve with a voice, to quote Prof. Higgins, 'that would shatter glass' sets the scene for what is to take place in Act 2.

Act 2 treats us to seeing Act 1 of the play from **behind** the scenes, the two storey set with staircase revolves to face upstage and we see what these actors get up to in the darkened wings of a theatre stage – nothing like what an audience sees from the front. The mayhem that takes place both back stage and on is fast and furious, the comedy situations, timing, slamming of many doors is excellent with laugh lines being well held.

For any one in the theatre this is a rib tickling tale that perhaps brings back agonising memories, remember when we played in....? I think we've all been there at some stage; but whilst this is all about actors and staging a play, **Noises Off** still has much to offer a general public audience.

This production by Heidelberg has been directed with panache, energy and excellent timing by Chris McLean; the ensemble comprising Justin Stephens, Rhiannon Leach, Nicola Wright, John Cheshire, Kate Bowers, Joshua Parnell and John Keogh the old burglar, never on cue, never on time, and a delightful Barbara Hughes as *Dotty Otley* all entered into the swing of the piece with energy and a great sense of fun. Usually seen in more dramatic works Paul Farrell as the long-suffering 'Director' showed a nice feel for comedy and brought authority to the role. The production had lots of pace, some neat business, physical and vocal energy and plenty of stage know how – technique to the fore.


Costumes, lighting and sound were of a high standard as was the setting – this is actually two settings – firstly the onstage two storey setting for 'the play' showing the living room of the country home with stairs and 7 doors that are required to slam, slam, slam and secondly the reverse of the 'onstage' setting showing the backstage angle as the play 'Nothing On' progresses.

To sum up, a well staged production, directed with energy and style that should see full houses at Heidelberg for the next couple of weeks. I also liked the two-way programme.

Noises Off continues until the 3rd December and you can book on 9457 4117. Get a ticket if you can, it's great fun and very slickly done.
