The Company is pleased to welcome Morgan Dowsett as director of **Knacker's ABC**. This is Morgan's first directorial role at HTC, and he brings to our stage a production that will delight and engage our audiences.

Boris Vian, French novelist and playwright, was a jazz connoisseur and critic, Dixieland trumpeter, and author of more than 400 songs. He was born in 1920 and died aged 39 in 1959.

Vian's avant-garde plays had much connection to the theatre of the absurd. **Knacker's ABC**, written in 1946, is a "paramilitary vaudeville " It is set in a Normandy knacker's yard, and depicts farcical marriage problems of a family on D-Day. The place is destroyed by wartime allies, the Free French, and other military personnel. So look forward to a night out with a difference, there is lots of energy and plenty of laughs.

The show has a large cast including faces well known at HTC; Chris Baldock, Adrian Valenta, Christian Gabriel and Joshua Parnell.

As well there are lots of newcomers to the HTC stage and the Company is pleased to welcome Christina Walls, Florence Rivière, Olivia Crang, Oliver Trew, Alex Christopoulos, Jordan Lee, Romain Hermelin, Curtis A. Farrell, Hano Kotevski and Tara Daniel



HIGHLIGHTS of the 2005 PRESIDENT's REPORT

Playbill

As we come to the close of 2005 we complete our 53rd year as a theatre company. Audience comments were both favourable regarding the quality of the productions and also at times critical, particularly with regard to language.

We were pleased to welcome first time directors to Heidelberg Theatre Company, John Keogh – **Born Yesterday**, and Chris McLean - **Noises Off**. In both cases these were very successful productions.

In addition, during the 2005 year, the HTC Youth performed **The Crucible** and **Peter Pan.** Youth group leader Gen Meehan and the dedicated team that make up HTC Youth Theatre were strongly supported by Anne Smith.

It is our hope that the experience gained by the HTC Youth group will provide the foundation for our future actors and back stage people in the mainstream of the theatre.

Bookings and Membership

Our secretary Brett Hunt has done an outstanding job managing the membership and subscription returns and database plus the distribution of *Prompts* via email. The work and efforts of June Cherry, Trevor McAllister, Julie Hall and Rose Capuano ensures that the box office runs without any hassles right through the season.

Financial

We have not embarked on any major expenditure items this year and our financial status has accordingly been kept in check to cope with the reduced income, which was as a result of lower audience attendances during the middle of the year. Our financial position remains sound and must remain so in order that we can continue to upgrade the theatre facilities and be provided with the resources to deliver the high standard of production quality that our audiences have come to expect.

Capital Expenditure

Expenditure was kept to a minium this year with a careful eye kept by our Treasurer, Bruce Akers.

HTC Committee

The Committee elected a second Vice President, Bruce Akers who is also the Company's Treasurer. This is in addition to our existing Vice President Wendy Drowley. The other Committee Members are Brett Hunt – Secretary, Alice Bugge, June Cherrey, Lena Minto, Maureen McInerney, Tim McLaughlan, Joan Moriarty, Anne Smith, Dennis Pain, Gen Meehan, Wayne Pearn and newly elected Patricia Tyler.

Important People

We have been fortunate this year to have Patricia Tyler take charge of the Front of House and Photography. We also appreciate the numerous volunteers who willing undertake the Front of House duties during the year.

Our talented team of Set Builders includes Paddy Moriarty, Ron Young, Jim Thomson, Dennis Pain, Ted Drowley and Ashley Phillips. Our technical and back stage crews include the talents of Simon Dixon, Struan McGregor, George Bissett, Tim McLaughlin, Stellios Karagiannis and many more who the audience will never see and Lena Minto and Alice Bugge for their work in organising publicity and advertising during the year.

The Company would also like thank Jan Howe for coordinating the various displays of local artists in the theatre foyer during the year.

Vale

We note the passing of Rita Finch, life member of HTC who was a founding member of the Heidelberg Rep in 1952 and was active both on stage and behind the scenes.

Also the passing of Jean Baker who was a past City of Heidelberg Councillor and past Mayor, in addition to being a strong supporter of HTC.

Lease

The Council has shown no urgency to formalise our occupation at Turnham Avenue and our occupation is currently on hold over as per the terms of the expired lease. The Council has confirmed that terms will not be commercial and will recognise the contribution that HTC has made to the facility. Community Involvement

We continue to make the theatre available for various community events. This includes groups such as the Heidelberg Film Society, and The Banyule City Council. The Heidelberg Theatre Company again participated in the Banyule Winter Festival. Our preview nights continue to be an opportunity for charity groups to raise money and organisations who took advantage of these nights were, Oxfam- Community Aid Abroad, Templestowe College, Banyule Support Group, Uniting Church, Amnesty International, Livingstone Community Centre, Heidelberg Lions and Linlithgow.

The 2005 year has been a challenging and rewarding year. As we prepare to enter the 2006 year we can safely report that the Heidelberg Theatre Company is in a sound position and ready to accept the challenges ahead and deliver a great season again.
