PLAY SUMMARY:

When a country house weekend takes a turn for the worse, Bertie Wooster is unwittingly called on to play matchmaker - reconciling the affections of his host's drippy daughter Madeline Basset with his newt-fancying acquaintance Gussie Fink-Nottle. If Bertie, ably assisted by the ever-dependable Jeeves, can't pull off the wedding of the season he'll be forced to abandon his cherished bachelor status and marry the ghastly girl himself!

Based on P.G. Wodehouse's *The Code of the Woosters,* this fast-paced, farcical comedy celebrates the iconic double act and promises a confidently charming piece of entertainment.

- **Bertie Wooster** (late 20s/30s), *played by himself*: upper-class gentleman, enthusiastic, but often dim-witted.
- Jeeves (30s/40s), *played by himself*: Bertie's valet, sensible with dry sense of humour.
- **Seppings** (late 40s/50s), *played by himself*: the butler of Bertie's Aunt, dignified and respectable.
- Sir Watkins Basset, to be played by Jeeves
- **Gussie Fink-Nottle,** to be played by Jeeves
- **Stiffy Byng,** to be played by Jeeves
- Madeline Bassett, to be played by Jeeves
- Aunt Dahlia, to be played by Seppings
- Antique-Shop Proprietor, to be played by Seppings
- **Roderick Spode,** to be played by Seppings
- Butterfield, to be played by Seppings
- **Constable Oates,** to be played by Seppings
